Elements Commonly Used for Print Sources

Book

Author(s). *Title of Book*. Publisher, Year.

If important, place city of publication before publisher followed by a comma [5.67]

Golding, William. Lord of the Flies. Penguin, 2006. OR

If important, place original publication date after title [5.108]

Golding, William. Lord of the Flies. 1954, New York, Penguin, 2006.

Article in a Reference Book or Edited Collection (Page numbers may be omitted for alphabetized sources) Author(s). "Title of Article." *Title of Book*, edited by Editor's Name(s), Volume, Publisher, Year, Pages.

"Poseidon." Ancient Greece and Rome: An Encyclopedia for Students, edited by Carroll Moulton, vol. 3, Charles Scribner's Sons, 1998, pp. 152-153.

Newspaper Article

Author(s). "Title of Article." Newspaper, Date, Pages.
